It is high time to return to the Gold and Silver Standard. Recent events have proven how unreliable our current currency system is. Our money can no longer be backed with "hope and good wishes". We need the Gold and Silver standard brought back to save our country from ruin. Is the Gold and Silver standard the only answer to our current problems? No, but it is a good start to get us out of the current crisis.
